CITY OF SHASTA LAKE RECEIVES 100% WATER ALLOCATION REMOVING ALL STAGES OF THE WATER SHORTAGE CONTINGENCY PLAN

Shasta Lake, Calif. (March 30, 2023) – The City of Shasta Lake received an update on March 28, 2023 that the Bureau of Reclamation (Bureau) will increase the Central Valley Project (CVP) 2023 water supply allocations.

Continued atmospheric river systems have since boosted hydrological conditions and storage volumes, allowing for a more robust water supply. These events have allowed the Bureau to revise their initial allocation of 75% to 100%. This is good news for all!

As of today, March 30, 2023, the City of Shasta Lake is no longer in any stage of its Water Shortage Contingency Plan. Please keep in mind that the State of California continues to require citizens to adhere to the following permanent restrictions:

- Hosing off sidewalks, driveways, and other hardscapes is strictly prohibited;
- Washing automobiles with hoses not equipped with a shut-off nozzle;
- Watering lawns in a manner that causes runoff, or within 48 hours after measurable precipitation;
- Using non-recirculated water in a fountain or other decorative feature;
- Maintains the ban on wasteful water uses, such as watering ornamental grass on commercial properties.
